Responsibilities

Orchard Junior School regards itself as a health-promoting school. It recognises that its staff act as role-models for pupils in all aspects of school life, including health promotion.

Second hand smoking – breathing in other people's smoke, has now been shown to cause lung cancer & heart disease in non-smokers, as well as many other illnesses & minor conditions.

This school acknowledges that breathing in other people's tobacco smoke is both a public health hazard and welfare issue.

Rationale:

- Smoking is the single most preventable cause of premature death and ill-health in our society.
- Passive smoking breathing other people's tobacco smoke is also potentially fatal.
 It has been shown to cause lung cancer, as well as many other illnesses, in non-smokers.
- Smoking is a health and safety issue for all adults who use the school: staff and parents.
- Everyone has the right to breathe clean air, and non-smokers are in the majority.
- Schools have a major role to play in working towards non-smoking being seen as the norm in society.
- Children need to receive consistent messages and require non-smoking role models within the school.

Objectives:

- To protect non-smokers from the adverse health effects of environmental tobacco smoke in the workplace.
- To demonstrate the school's commitment to promoting the health of pupils and staff.
- To provide information and advice for those who wish to stop smoking.

Restrictions on smoking

Staff

All staff - teaching, peripatetic, support and non-teaching and pupils may not smoke (including e-cigarettes or equivalent) while on school premises or whilst conducting any school duties – building and playgrounds.

Parents

Parents may not smoke while on school premises (including e-cigarettes or equivalent). Letters will be sent home to parents informing them of the policy.

Visitors

The smoking policy applies to all visitors to the school - for example, parents, suppliers, supply or temporary staff, and contractors. The following arrangements have been made for informing visitors of the policy's existence:

- Clear signs will be sited around the school building.
- Staff members will inform visitors of the policy when necessary.

School related activities

The prohibition of smoking will apply during related school activities undertaken outside school premises, e.g. educational Visits.

School premises utilised outside normal working hours

When school premises are used for purposes other than school related activities the school smoking policy will still remain in operation.

School Minibuses

Smoking is prohibited in vehicles used to transport children. This includes parents travelling for school purposes with children in the car under the 2015 Children and Family Act.

Implementing and monitoring

- Members of staff will have access to this policy via the Google Drive, which will become part of their contract of employment.
- Parents will be informed of the Policy.
- Members of staff shall inform school visitors of the Policy.
- Signs and notices shall be posted in prominent positions throughout the school premises.

The school smoking policy will be reviewed every three years, and if appropriate revised, by the Governing Body.
